

88th DISTRICT COURT PROBATION

The purpose of the Probation Department for the District Court is to assist the judge in determining an appropriate sentence. They are tasked with assisting the Court by preparing presentence reports and providing supervision to adult probationers ensuring that they comply with the terms and conditions of the orders of the court.

Probation officers are responsible for referring and coordinating probationers with counseling and qualified treatment personnel to monitor and assist in addressing effective methods of rehabilitation. Probation officers are also responsible for holding probationers accountable for their actions but also protecting the community by facilitating long term changes.

Supervision may vary individually. Examples of types of probation supervision are: intensive probation, reporting or non-reporting status, or mail report status. Supervision is at the discretion of the probation officer.

Probationers are to report to their probation officer monthly, unless otherwise directed. Probation report is as follows:

Reporting schedule is arranged by last name.
Time: 9am to noon and 1pm to 4pm.

A-G	1 st Thursday of the Month
H-M	2 nd Thursday of the Month
N-S	3 rd Thursday of the Month
T-Z	4 th Thursday of the Month.
